#### **School Context**

### **Analysis**

Reading and writing results are the highest for 3 years and maths for 2 years. Reading, Writing and Maths are above National figures and combined is significantly above. Interventions, which we are now calling adaptations show:

- Out of the 6 girls targeted for maths, all 6 achieved expected 100%.

Phonics results for the last 2 years have been above National: 2022-23 83% 79% 2023-24 81% 80% with 1 child disapplied 85%. Out of the 12 children who had targeted intervention 11 passed – 92%, with 1 child going from 4 to 29. In Y2, the PP & SEND pupil went from a score of 0 in Y1 to 20 in Y2. Next Steps: Early adaptations in Y1 for the children in YR who have not met phonic targets.
