#### English

Our focus in writing has been to develop our descriptive writing skills, incorporating atmosphere and dialogue into first and third person writing. The children have shown the ability to create some fabulous writing when following the skills practised, and will hopefully be able to use and develop these skills in independent tasks throughout the year. Of course, good writers come from being good readers and we have exposed the children to quality texts such as 'The Wolves of Currumpaw' and the gritty real life adventures found in 'Survivors'. #### <u>Maths</u>

We have focused on understanding place value, addition, subtraction and multiplication, working towards the curriculum objectives for each year group. Some children have found multiplying by 2 digits challenging, so any practice given to this would be appreciated. To help further, some of the children need to speed up and develop their times tables knowledge- as we progress through the year, the children will need this knowledge more and more. #### Art/DT

In Art, we have seen some colourful and exciting batik work produced by the children. The children have had to make wooden frames, explore the idea of using a resist in design, create and adapt their ideas, before finally producing a final piece using wax, ink and silk.

#### **Geography**

We had a great day out when we visited the Natural History Museum in London to find out about earthquakes and volcanoes, which greatly enhanced the children's understanding of the topic work covered in class.

#### **Other subjects**

We have been covering French as our chosen language, recapping some key vocabulary for year 6 and introducing the language to year 5. In Religion we found out about the importance of the five pillars in the Muslim faith and what happens when pilgrims visit the Hajj in Saudi Arabia. Computing has been a reminder to the children of the importance of e-safety- spotting dangers and learning how to respond appropriately.
