




Read Write Inc. Phonics and Fresh Start

- The groups are deciding from ongoing





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Progress groups

- Group children by phonic stages.
- Teach to the group's challenge level.
- Re-assess all children every half term.
- Children needing additional support will be given his through additional interventions.
- For these children, teachers may send home some virtual lessons and additional resources so you can support them at home.

One of the most complex alphabetic codes in the world!



Reading books for home

Read, Write Inc. Phonics books will be changed once a week.

Children will come home with:


- a book bag RWI reading book
- If applicable, a previously read RWI Storybooks for extra practice
- a quality text from the library and/or their classroom book area. This will be different to reception initially.



What can I do?

Ask your child to read the sounds and words before they read the story.

They will enjoy teaching you to read these words too.




What can I do?

- 1. Avoid reading the story to them first.
- 2. Avoid asking your child to guess a word by looking the pictures.
- 3. Try not to become irritable if your child ever struggles!
- 4. Use pure sounds rather than letter names.
- 5. Use Fred Talk to help your child to read and spell words.
- 6. Listen to your child read their Storybook every day.
- 7. Read stories to your child every day.




Read Write Inc. Phonics – information for parents
